# Twinkie Chan Strawberry Cake Scarf

*You don't have to be a foodie to love this scarf.  
 It's fun to make and delicious to look at!*

## Stitches Used:

- Chain stitch
- Foundation row
- Single crochet
- Half double crochet
- Double crochet

## Finished Measurements:

Scarf is approx. 5" (13 cm) x 68" (2 cm).  
 Each cake slice is approx. 5" (13 cm) x 4 ½" (11.5 cm)

## Supplies:

### Yarn for Strawberry Cake Slices:

- 1 Skein – Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® – Pink
- 2 Skeins – Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® – White

### Yarn for Strawberries:

- 1 Skein – Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice® – Scarlet
- 1 Skein – Caron® Simply Soft – Limelight

### Optional yarn colors

#### Yarn for Chocolate Cake Slice:

- 1 Skein – Red Heart® Super Saver® – Coffee
- 1 or 2 Skeins – Red Heart® Super Saver® – Pale Yellow

#### Yarn for Blue Cake Slice:

- 1 Skein – Lily® Sugar 'n Cream® – Hot Blue
- 1 or 2 Skeins – Lily® Sugar 'n Cream® – White

- Crochet hook size H8/5.00mm
- Yarn needle

### Optional:

- 5mm pom poms, fabric glue

## Gauge:

Perfect gauge is not essential for this project, since you can keep adding Cake Slices until your scarf is the desired length, but here is Twinkie Chan's gauge: Lion Brand® Vanna's Choice®: 14 sc x 16 rows = 4" x 4" (10 cm x 10 cm); Caron® Simply Soft®: 19 chs = 4" (10 cm)

## Abbreviations:

## Tip:

There are yarn options offered in the supply list. As noted, all will work beautifully for the scarf because gauge is not critical to the project. Select the yarn and colors you prefer.

## Notes:

Cake Slice—make 15, or as many as you need for your desired scarf length

## Cake Slice

With H hook and Pink, ch 17.

**Row 1:** Sk 1st ch, 1 sc in each ch. (16)

**Rows 2–4:** Ch 1, turn. 1 sc in each st. (16)—Drop Pink and join White. You should carry the Pink while working the White, but if you are not comfortable with this, you can always break off and re-join later.

**Row 5:** With White, ch 2, turn. 1 hdc in each st. (16)—Break off White and pick up Pink.

**Rows 6–9:** With Pink, ch 1, turn. 1 sc in each st. (16)—Break off Pink and join White.

**Rows 10–12:** With White, ch 2, turn. 1 hdc in each st. (16)

## You'll now work 1 rnd of hdc around your cake slice.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 2, turn. 1 hdc in the next 15 sts. In the last hdc of Row 12, work 3 hdc. Rotate your project so that you are working down the edge of all of your Rows. Work 14 hdc evenly down to the next corner of your Cake Slice. Work 2 more hdc into the corner. Rotate your project so that you are working on the bottom of the Cake Slice. Work 15 hdc evenly to the next corner. Work 2 more hdc into the corner. Rotate your project to work on the last edge of the Cake Slice. Work 14 hdc evenly to the last corner. Work 1 more hdc into the corner, and then sl st to 1st—Break off leaving about 24 inches of yarn for sewing later. Weave in all other ends.

## Strawberry—make 14, or one for each Cake Slice, minus one

With H hook and Scarlet, make magic ring, or, ch 3 and sl st to 1st ch to form ring.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, 6 sc into ring. Sl st to 1st sc to join. (6)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, (2 sc into next st) 3 times. In the next st, work 2 sc, 1 dc. In the next st work 1 dc, 2 sc. 3 sc into last st. Sl st to 1st sc to join. (15)—Break off leaving 12 inches of yarn for sewing later, and join Limelight.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 4, sl st in same st. (In next st, work sl st, ch 4, sl st) 2 times.—Break off and weave in Limelight ends.

# Twinkie Chan Strawberry Cake Scarf

## Assembly

1. Sew your Cake Slices together from top to bottom to form a scarf. Place one Cake Slice above another Cake Slice, with the right side of Rnd 1 of the Cake Slices facing you, and use the long yarn tail from the bottom slice to sew the two pieces together. Keep adding Cake Slices in the same manner. Make one strand with 8 Cake Slices, and a second strand with 7 Cake Slices. Having different lengths for the strands ensures that the join in your scarf will not be dead center, which can look strange when worn. Also, the two separate strands ensure that all your Cake Slices will appear upright when the scarf is worn, rather than having one side look upside down.
2. After completing two separate strands, sew the tops of the strands together to connect them, still ensuring that the right side of Rnd 1 of all the Cake Slices is facing you.
3. Sew one Strawberry to top of each Cake Slice, using your long Scarlet yarn tail. Making the top of the Strawberry overlap with the Cake Slice above it will make your cake look more realistic. There will only be one Strawberry where the two strands join. Alternatively, if you want to use felt to make strawberries, cut out your strawberry shapes as well as strawberry stem shapes, and either glue or sew them to the top of each Cake Slice.
4. Glue pompoms to Cake Slices to look like cake sprinkles.
