# What will you make today?



Bow Necklace +Bow Bobby Pin + Large Bow Gift Topper with Jenny Doh

## Finished measurement for:

small bow: 2 x ½ inches (5 x 1.3cm)

large bow: 3 x 1 inches (7.6 x 2.5cm)

### What You'll Need:

- Less than 1 ball superfine fingering or baby-weight yarn
- Small amount of light worsted-weight yarn
- Size C Crochet hook
- Bobby pin
- Hand embroidery needle
- Small white button
- Spray bottle
- Medium white button (2)
- Bobby pin

Abbreviations: ch: chain sc: single crochet sl st: slip stitch

### Small Bow Necklace

TO BEGIN THE BOW: With A, ch 21.

ROW 1: sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn (20 sc).

ROW 2-3: ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Fasten off. Fold the work in half, bringing the short sides together. With A and a tapestry needle, whipstitch the short sides together. This is the center back seam. With a tapestry needle and one of the tails, sew the center back to the center front with small reinforcement stitches. Wrap the other tail around the center of the piece (over the reinforcement stitches) several times, and pull tight to create the bow.

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#### Small Bow Necklace, continued:

**ROW 2-3, CONTINUED:** During the final wrap, thread a small white button onto the yarn. Tie the two tails together in the back and weave in all ends.

**CORD, PART 1:** With right side of the bow facing you, draw up a loop of A in the top left corner of the bow, work ch stitches to desired length. Ch 5 more stitches, sl st in the 5th ch from hook for button loop. Fasten off.

**CORD, PART 2:** Draw up a loop of A in the top right corner of the bow, work ch stitches to desired length. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread a medium white button to the tail and with a tapestry needle, weave in the end.

Note: Hemp yarn tends to curl and pucker at times, when crocheted or knitted moistening the work with water and allowing it to dry will remove the curling and puckering.

# Bow Bobby Pin:

To create a Bow Bobby Pin, create a crocheted bow as above. With tapestry needle and A, make a reinforcement stitch at the center back. Slide bobby pin into the stitch and tie the ends together and weave in all ends.

# Large Bow Gift Topper:

TO BEGIN THE BOW: With A, ch 31.

**ROW 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn (30 sc).

ROW 2-5: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Fasten off. Fold the work in half, bringing the short sides together. With A and a tapestry needle, whipstitch the short sides together. This is the center back seam. With a tapestry needle and one of the tails sew the center back to the center front with small reinforcement stitches.

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# Large Bow Gift Topper, continued:

**ROW 2-5, CONTINUED:** Wrap the other tail around the center of the piece (over the reinforcement stitches) several times, and pull tight to create the bow. Tie the two tails together in the back.

**TO BEGIN THE CIRCLE TRIM:** With B, ch 5, sl st in first ch to form a ring. Ch 1, work 10 sc in the ring. Fasten off.

With a tapestry needle and A, sew the circle trim to the center front of bow with a small reinforcement stitch. Weave in all ends, except for the tails on the bow. Wrap gift with newsprint paper, wrap with A, and attach the large boew to the gift with the leftover tails. Trim excess.

### FAQ's

Q: Can I use a different size hook?

A: Probably. As long as the different size is just one or two off from the one listed, it should be ok.

Q: What kind of yarn is Jenny using?

A: Jenny is using 3-ply hemp yarn for this project, but you can use any super fine, fingering, or baby-weight yarn that you have on hand. For the green circle on the gift topper variation, Jenny is using Lion Brand LB Collection Cotton Bamboo in Snapdragon, but you can use use any light worsted-weight or double-knitting (DK) yarn that you have.
