Easy Beginner's iPhone Cozy Crochet Pattern

This is a simple crochet cozy that allows the beginner to practice four basic crochet stitches: single crochet (sc), half double crochet (hdc), double crochet (dc) and treble crochet (tr). You crochet a simple rectangle and then seam the edges together to create the cozy.

Materials:

- 1 ball bulky weight (weight 5) yarn (samples use Isaac Mizrahi Craft Skyscraper yarn in color Seagram) ... 1 ball will make multiple cozies
- Size G/6 (4.25 mm) crochet hook

Ch 11

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each subsequent ch (10 sc)

Row 2: Turn, ch 1 (counts as first sc), sc in next st and each st across (10 sc)

Row 3: Repeat row 2

Row 4: Turn, ch 2 (count as first dc), dc in next st and each st across (10 dc)

Row 5-6: Repeat Row 4

Row 7: Turn, ch 3 (counts as first tr), tr in next st and each st across (10 tr)

Row 8-9: Repeat Row 7

Row 10: Turn, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), hdc in next st and each st across (10 hdc)

Row 11-12: Repeat Row 10

Row 13-15: Repeat Row 7

Row 16-18: Repeat Row 4

Row 19-21: Repeat Row 2

Finishing: Fold rectangle in half so that the set of hdc stitches in the middle become the folded base of the iPhone cozy. Seam up the two long sides (leaving the top open to slide the iPhone inside). Note: you can use the seaming method you prefer. In this example, I've used single crochet stitches all the way around the three sides (including across the bottom, reinforcing the bottom and allowing me to avoid finishing off and weaving in more ends. Another option is to single crochet or slip stitch together only the two open long sides.)
